Residents Praise Quality of Life, City Services in Latest Survey

City staff presented results from the 2022 Citizen Survey to City Council during a December 2022 worksession. The survey was available online to all residents in late 2022. The City received 1,841 responses, up from 1,317 responses to the prior survey. The survey has been conducted every few years since 2010 and is an important tool for gathering citizen feedback on priorities and satisfaction levels.

Citizen satisfaction across the board remains high in Colleyville. Ninety-five percent of survey takers said they were satisfied or very satisfied with the overall quality of life. Satisfaction was also high in terms of encouraging economic growth and planning for the future needs of residents, both of which increased from the 2019 survey. The City's core services also received high marks including fire protection, emergency medical services, police, library programs, and municipal court. Satisfaction with community events also increased substantially and 71% of respondents had attended at least one City of the City of t



increased substantially and 71% of respondents had attended at least one City event in the last 12 months.

One area the survey focused on was economic development. A majority of respondents (57%) felt the City should purchase commercial property and buildings for the purpose of ensuring quality development. There was also strong support (73%) in favor of the City pursuing the purchase of open space, primarily for open park land or natural state open space.

The other major focus area of the survey was about citizens' transportation priorities. A total of 59% preferred a maintenance/ repaving approach to road work, as opposed to full reconstruction. Similarly, 59% of respondents also believe that peak traffic needs are met by current roadway design. Results were evenly mixed when it came to preferred traffic mitigation techniques. Both road widening and keeping current road widths were preferred by 34% of respondents, respectively, while 32% preferred the use of traffic control measures. The top needs identified for transportation were sidewalks and trails and roundabouts.

Mayor Lindamood said the survey results were insightful and provide needed input for future decision making. City Council and staff use the results of the survey to guide priorities for 2023 and beyond. For more information, visit <u>Colleyville.com</u>.

Economic Activity Around Town

Commercial activity is bustling throughout Colleyville as the City's economic development efforts continue to bear fruit. Several years ago, the City purchased six acres at SH26 and Acuff with the goal to clear the site and sell to a developer for quality development at the south end of the City. Demolition of the structures is complete, and the City is working with a Dallas-Fort Worth-based development company on a retail, restaurant, and office project. Similarly, the 3.81-acre property the city purchased at the southeast corner of SH26 and John McCain has received tremendous interest after being listed in December. The City anticipates a contract for the land for retail, restaurant, and office uses in the coming weeks.



New tenants are moving to Colleyville as well. Black Rifle Coffee recently opened in the former Dunkin' Donuts site near LOOK Cinema and Market Street. HTeaO has demolished the foundation of the old Sonic at Glade and SH26 for their new location that will open early 2023. Zafiro's Mexican Grill and Cantina is nearly ready to open in the former medical office building close to Main Street. This locally-owned, upscale bar and grill concept at 5205 Colleyville Blvd. is a welcome addition to the corridor.

Filing for City Council Places Open Soon

Candidate filing for City Council seats for the May 6 General Election are open from January 18 to February 19. The City of Colleyville will conduct a General Election on May 6 to elect City Councilmembers for Places 3 and 4. Applications will be available at the City Secretary's Office on the third floor of Colleyville City Hall, 100 Main Street or online at Colleyville.com starting January 3.

City Councilmembers are elected to three-year terms. Candidates must be a resident of the City of Colleyville or within an incorporated area annexed by the City, according to the City Charter. Candidates must have been a resident for at least 12 months, be qualified voters of the State of Texas and the City of Colleyville, and cannot be financially delinquent to the City.
