Community Spotlight: Colleyville Chamber of Commerce

In this edition, we sat down with Mark Alphonso, 2023 Board Chair, to spotlight the great work of the Colleyville Chamber of Commerce.

Mark and his family moved to Colleyville in 2015. You may know him as the owner of the Montclair Events Venue in Colleyville. With a background in commercial construction, he segued into owning his own events venue. Sewer Averaging Begins in December

The City of Colleyville averages individual household water consumption during December, January, and February to set residential sewer rates for the year. For households that have no preceding winter months usage, Colleyville uses an average of 9,000 gallons as set by city ordinance. During the winter months, residents should be aware of all unnecessary water usage, dripping faucets, leaking toilets, etc. to minimize their monthly sewer bill during these



months. Wastewater averaging provides a measure that is generally reflective of the amount of water that goes directly into the sanitary sewer system from each property. This is considered the most equitable way to determine the sewer volume.

December, January, and February are used to calculate the sewer average, as that time period provides a true picture of interior water use when water consumption is not impacted by outdoor water use such as filling swimming pools and lawn sprinkler systems. Water averaging allows customers the opportunity to lower their monthly sewer bill by reducing water use during winter months and keeps the sewer charges consistent each month.

The calculation process is repeated every year in the same manner. While many households may not see a big change from year to year, some homes may actually see a drop or rise in the wastewater charge because of the calculations from the three month period.

News & Announcements From GCISD

GCISD's Career and Technical Education (CTE) Program launched a pharmacy course at the start of the 2023-2024 school year, which is providing students the opportunity to get real-world experiences through practicums at local pharmacies and earn their certification as a pharmacy technician before they graduate from high school.

Two days out of the week, they intern at local pharmacies within the GCISD community. The rotations started in the later part of October with students working alongside a pharmacy technician or the pharmacist. In preparation to do so, students had to apply for and receive a technician trainee license through the Texas State Board of Pharmacy.

In the classroom, students are learning everything that will prepare them to take the Exam for the Certification of Pharmacy Technicians, or ExCPT, in the spring. Their studies include the top 200 drugs used, along with their brand and generic names, the safety side of the dispensing process, as well as different indications for different types of medications and their purpose.

Additionally, they learn about the different organizations that oversee pharmacies like the Food and Drug Administration (FDA) and Drug Enforcement Agency (DEA) as well as the continuing education credits that are needed to maintain their licenses and professional organizations that they can join.
