Police Chief Presents Annual Crime Report



Colleyville Police Chief Michael Miller presented the annual Crime Report to City Council during the February I worksession, which highlighted trends in crime that occurred in the past year.

Data shows that Colleyville saw a 20% decrease in Part 1 crimes in 2021 (157 vs. 126). Part 1 crimes in clude violent crimes (murder, rape, robbery, and aggravated assault) as well as property crimes (burglary, theft, motor vehicle theft, and arson). This is the lowest crime rate we have seen in Colleyville in at least the last 37 years (publicly available data from the FBI only goes back to 1985). We believe this may be the lowest crime rate ever seen in Colleyville's history. Chief Miller

points out that any success in reducing crime is the result of the close partnership the Police Department has with our community. "Keeping Colleyville safe is everyone's job and we couldn't do it without our residents and business owners," Chief Miller said.

While overall crime went down in 2021, violent crime actually increased during the same period. The largest increase was seen in Aggravated Assaults, which increased from 3 to 14 reported cases this year. This is consistent with a national trend of increasing violent crime rates. The majority of the Aggravated Assault cases in our city were domestic in nature involving family members. Chief Miller said research has shown an increase in domestic violence across the nation, possibly linked to COVID-19 isolation and job related issues.

Chief Miller concluded his presentation by highlighting the successes the department achieved in 2021 that included winning two prestigious international awards by the International Association of Chiefs of Police and achieving national accreditation by the Commission on Accreditation for Law Enforcement Agencies (CALEA).

Colleyville General Election Information

The City of Colleyville will conduct a General Election on Saturday, May 7 to elect a Mayor and Councilmembers for Places I and 2 to the City Council. While the election is not until May, there are important dates to note.

The last day to register to vote for the May 7 General Election is Thursday, April 7. The last day to apply for a ballot by mail (received, not postmarked) is Wednesday, April 20. Colleyville Public Library, 110 Main Street, is one of 44 early voting sites in Tarrant County, from Monday, April 25 to Tuesday, May 3, and an Election Day voting site on May 7.

Glade Road Project Work Continues

Work to improve Glade Road continues, with Phase II (Stafford to Montclair) wrapping up this summer. Phase III, the section from Montclair to Pool, will follow later this year. In February, the City Council approved a contract for the lowering of the intersection at Glade and Bluebonnet, which will eliminate the 3-way stop. This project received federal grant funding, requiring it to be bid separately from the rest of the Glade Road Project. The significant change in elevation of the roadway (7 ft.) requires additional precautions during construction.
