Help get the word out about storm drains and pollution by marking the storm drains in your neighborhood!



Do you know where water in the storm drain goes?

The rainwater that is received by a storm drain empties directly into our streams, creeks, and lakes. With no filtration or treatment, this rainwater takes with it everything that it picks up along the way including: fertilizers, pesticides, dirt and leaves, car fluids, pet waste, and litter.

Why mark storm drains?

By marking storm drains with a message such as "No Dumping Drains to Creek," we can better educate our neighbors about the connection between storm drain systems and water quality. We also hope to remind people that their daily actions can affect the water quality of our streams, creeks, and lakes.

How can you get involved?

Volunteers assist us with storm drain marking in Colleyville and there are hundreds of storm drains throughout the city. We are looking for local residents, students, and community groups to help mark storm drains starting in late spring and continuing through the fall.
